

1.'New' Plant Community Types are displaying in the BioNet Threatened Biodiversity Database Collection

Plant community type (PCT) ID codes and PCT names for the new East Coast PCTs classification planned for release later this year have begun to appear in the Threatened Biodiversity Database Collection (TBDC). This results from a recent upload to the TBDC of new PCT ID codes into the vegetation type tab for threatened species and ecological communities. The new PCTs were added to the TBDC to allow department officers to review threatened species associations with the new PCTs.

The East Coast PCT's have a status of new. This is because the new classification has not been formally approved for release to be published in the BioNet Vegetation Classification database.

Therefore, accredited assessors must not consider these PCTs in the assessment of threatened species or ecological communities when applying the Biodiversity Assessment Method (BAM). The relevant PCT data in the BAM-C includes only those PCTs with a status of 'In progress' or 'Complete'. These can be viewed in the TBDC by scrolling down the page (or, in some cases, by navigating to subsequent pages on the list) to the PCTs with a status of 'In Progress' or 'Complete'.


3. Scheduled BAM data import is on hold


The Biodiversity Assessment Method (BAM) data import and proposed update to the list of Serious and irreversible impacts (SAII) entities planned for the end of April is on hold. The delay will allow the finalisation of release notes that describe the changes to the biodiversity data in BioNet that is currently referenced by the BAM-C. We will provide advice on a new date for the planned data import shortly.


